Karl Bowman, W4CHX, Named 2018 Roanoke Division Service Award Winner

North Carolina Section Manager Karl Bowman, W4CHX, is the recipient of the 51st annual Roanoke Division Service Award. Begun in 1968, the award recognizes an ARRL member in the four states of the Roanoke Division who exemplifies positive spirit and contributions to Ham Radio operators throughout the region. Voting for nominees is done by previous award recipients.

Karl has been North Carolina Section Manager since 2014, and is a past president of RARS. He holds a Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine (DVM), and is a retired faculty member of the School of Veterinary Medicine at North Carolina State University where he specialized in large animals. Karl's wife Gale, K4GGB, is also a DVM in private practice. Their son Sean is KJ4EGT.

"Karl is enormously deserving of this honor", said Roanoke Division Manager, Karl Director Jim Boehner, N2ZZ, "because he typifies the leadership qualities for which Roanoke Division operators are known." Karl received a plaque of recognition before his home club, the Raleigh Amateur Radio Society (RARS), at its Friday night dinner before the RARSFest hamfest.

Since becoming Section Director, Karl has focused on raising standards for emergency response capabilities through ARRL's Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®) and its coordination with AUXCOMM, a Dept. of Homeland Security initiative.
