Begun in 2022, the Town Halls are a series of live one hour video broadcasts which bring you up to date on what is happening with ARRL and Amateur Radio in general in the four states in the division. The format is lively, with lots of interactive conversation. Members get to ask questions via a chat feature and can follow comments in real time.

If you are receiving this newsletter and newsletters from your Section Manager, there is nothing you need to do to sign up. A few days before the next Town Hall on September 14, you will receive a hyperlink to click on to get into the videoconference. Topics for discussion in this Town Hall will be the recently announced dues increase, why a separate subscrip-

tion fee for the print edition of QST, and updates on happenings in Washington, DC, including efforts to get the FCC to move on proposed regulations, some of which are seven years old.

Can't make the live broadcast on September 14? No problem—watch the replay afterwards on YouTube. Join the hundreds of other ARRL members who have said this is the most informative hour about Amateur Radio in our region.

Marc had served as the SC Section Manager since 2010, and before that he had been the South Carolina Section Technical Coordinator. He earned his Ph.D. in electrical engineering from the U. of South Carolina. At the time of his death Marc had just retired as the Vice President of Business Services for York County Technical College in Rock Hill. A memorial service was held at the college on May 20th with many Hams in attendance. ARRL named John Gendron, NJ4Z, to complete Marc's term of office. He leaves behind his wife Lee, W7LEE, and two daughters, Austin and Marley.
